**ARE YOU READY?**

Effective April 22, 2010, new EPA regulations will affect all environmental companies that conduct renovations or repairs including painting or window replacements for any type of compensation on housing constructed prior to 1978, in facilities that can be occupied by children under the age of six, such as child care facilities, or where the residents include pregnant women.

Every firm or individual performing this type of work will be required to have at least one employee who has attended the 8-hour Lead Renovator course conducted by an EPA certified firm.

Developed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), in collaboration with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), the class will train contractors who perform building renovations or repairs and painting and window contractors on how to work safely in house with lead-based paint and comply with EPA's Renovation, Repair and Painting (RRP) Rule and HUD's Lead Safe Housing Rule. The course addresses health and concerns; regulations; before, during and after work procedures; recordkeeping and training non-certified workers
