“MAKING THE TRANSITION TO GREEN CLEAN PRODUCTS”

Bob Williams has a bachelors’ degree in Biology from the University of California Los Angeles (UCLA) and a master’s degree in Environmental and Occupational Health from the California State University Northridge (CSUN). He is a Certified Industrial Hygienist (CIH) and a Council Certified Indoor Environmental Consultant (CIEC). He has worked in health and safety for, Globe Union, the company that makes the Sear Die Hard battery, Rockwell International on the B1 Bomber and the MK Missile programs, UCLA, Western Airlines and finally at the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power for the past 24 years. During his employment at UCLA he taught health and safety classes for union workers in Southern California and he developed and taught the first industrial hygiene class for graduate students in the UCLA School of Public Health. In addition to teaching at UCLA he has taught at the University of Redlands, CSUN and the Antelope Valley College (AVC).

Mr. Williams will speak about his experience with managing the transition to Green Cleaning Products for a large Southern California Utility. Green Cleaning Products are safer for the workers who apply them; they improve indoor air quality and they help to protect the environment. The use of Green Cleaning Products is required for a pre-existing building to become Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certified. Mr. Williams will discuss how this type of program should be implemented and problems he encountered.

LEADERSHIP IN ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL DESIGN (LEED) REQUIREMENTS: CREDITS AND ACCREDITATION

Michael Andrews, CIH, CSP, LEED AP

Mr. Andrew is an environmental health consultant in Forensic Analytical Consulting Services' Los Angeles area office. He has conducted environmental health assessments all over the US and the world. Mr. Andrew specializes in evaluating biological and chemical hazards in both industrial and non-industrial environments. Mr. Andrew is a member of the AIHA Green Building Working Group. He is a Certified Industrial Hygienist, a Certified Safety Professional, and LEED accredited professional.

The growth in the area of "green" building has been quickly expanding. Definitions of green building may vary, but in general, creating healthy environments in which to work and live [indoor environmental quality (IEQ)] is a prominent feature of current green building rating systems. This presentation will provide a background and description of the most well known of the rating systems, the USGBC's Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) including recent changes to the system itself (LEED v.3) and how one gets accredited. This presentation will also examine the opportunities in the market for indoor air quality professionals including a real world application case study.
