LEAD Certification Training for Contractors

Lead Certified Renovator, Initial – 8 hours

Beginning April 2010, contractors performing work that disturbs lead-based paint in homes, child-care facilities, or schools built before 1978 must be certified by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and follow specific work practices to prevent lead contamination. Information regarding firm certification can be found at www.epa.gov/lead

You will acquire the skills, knowledge and certification to comply with EPA's Renovation, Repair and Painting Rule while learning safe work practices for renovating housing with lead-based paint. After completion of the training and passing the written exam, students will be certified per regulatory requirements. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has approved this course for purposes of certification to conduct renovation, repair and painting activities pursuant to Section 402 of the Toxic Substances Control Act (15 U.S.C. 2682).
